**PETITION OF KENTUCKY UTILITIES COMPANY FOR
CONFIDENTIAL PROTECTION OF RESPONSE TO CERTAIN
ITEMS OF COMMISSION STAFF'S SECOND DATA REQUEST**

Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU") hereby petitions the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7 and KRS 61.878(1)(m)(1) to grant confidential protection for the documents described herein, which KU is providing in response to Items 2(a), 4(b), 10 and 11 of the Commission Staff's February 2, 2011 Second Information Request to KU. KU seeks confidential protection of the documents, in their entirety, that are responsive to these items. In support of this Petition, KU states as follows:

1. Item 2(a) of Commission Staff's Second Information Request requests information relating to "which KU lines the 125 MW flows on and the amount that flows on each line." Item 4(b) requests a description of "the KU transmission lines used to serve this load." Item 10 asks for "complete load flow studies" and related flow charts. Finally, Item 11 requests "the results of this study for base and contingency conditions if the most updated or current load flow model is utilized."

2. In response Items 2(a), 4(b), 10 and 11, is providing the requested load flow and transmission information and related system design information in the attached sealed envelope. However, the requested information is critical electrical system infrastructure information as defined in KRS 61.878(1)(m)(1)(f)-(g). Under the Kentucky Open Records Act, the Commission is entitled to withhold from public disclosure information confidentially disclosed to it to the extent that open disclosure would:

have a reasonable likelihood of threatening the public safety by exposing a vulnerability in preventing, protecting against, mitigating, or responding to a terrorist act and limited to: ... (f) infrastructure records that expose a vulnerability referred to in this subparagraph through the disclosure of the location, configuration, or security of critical systems, including public utility critical systems. These critical systems shall include but not be limited to information technology, communication, electrical, fire suppression, ventilation, water, wastewater, sewage, and gas systems; (g) the following records when their disclosure will expose a vulnerability referred to in this subparagraph: detailed drawings, schematics, maps, or specifications of structural elements, floor plans, and operating, utility, or security systems of any building or facility owned, occupied, leased, or maintained by a public agency. See KRS 61.878(1)(m)(1).

3. Public disclosure of the information contained in these documents would have a reasonable likelihood of threatening the public safety by rendering such critical facilities more easily subject to terrorist attack. Therefore, the information is confidential in nature and is protected from public disclosure pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7 and KRS 61.878(1)(m)(1).


4. If the Commission disagrees with this request for confidential protection, it must hold an evidentiary hearing (a) to protect KU's due process rights and (b) to supply the Commission with a complete record to enable it to reach a decision with regard to this matter. Utility Regulatory Commission v. Kentucky Water Service Company, Inc., Ky. App., 642 S.W.2d 591, 592-94 (1982).

5. KU is willing to disclose the confidential information, pursuant to a protective agreement, to intervenors and others with a legitimate interest in this information and as required by the Commission. In accordance with the provisions of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7, KU attaches hereto one copy of the confidential documents. As KU seeks confidential protection of these documents in their entirety, the highlighting and redacting procedures (including supplying ten copies of what would be fully redacted documents) of 807 KAW 5:0001, Section 7 are inapplicable.

WHEREFORE, KU respectfully requests that the Commission grant confidential protection for the information at issue, or in the alternative, schedule an evidentiary hearing on all factual issues while maintaining the confidentiality of the information pending the outcome of the hearing.
