PUBLIC NOTICE

The Kentucky Department of Military Affairs announces the availability of a draft Environmental Assessment (EA) that evaluates the potential environmental impacts associated with the proposed construction of a Qualification Training Range (QTR) and Tactical Training Base (TTB) to be located at the Wendell H. Ford Regional Training Center (WHFRTC) in Muhlenberg County, Kentucky.

The 11,086-acre WHFRTC is owned by the Commonwealth of Kentucky and is operated by the Kentucky Department of Military Affairs (KDMA) for training of National Guard and Reserve Components of the armed forces. The site supports requirements for light maneuver training, weapons qualifications, range operations, equipment use, and other combat readiness training activities. The proposed QTR will include 10 firing lanes to train and test individual soldiers using a variety of weapons on stationary and moving targets. Support buildings will include a range control tower, operations/storage building, latrine, ammo breakdown building, bleacher enclosure and vehicle parking. The proposed TTB project area will be used to simulate a forward operating base and shall include fencing, guard towers and concrete pads for tents to replicate conditions in Afghanistan. The project area will be located on reclaimed coal strip mine land.

Based on the information in the Draft EA, a finding of no significant impact to the surrounding environment is supported.

This Draft EA is available for public review and comment for a thirty (30) day period and may be reviewed at the Central City Public Library located at 108 East Broad Street in Central City, or at the Harbin Memorial Library located at 117 South Main Street in Greenville, Kentucky during normal business hours.

To ensure that all concerns are considered, public comments are being solicited. Comments for consideration by the Department of Military Affairs in the final document should be provided in writing to Lt. Col. Kirk Hilbrecht, Public Affairs Office, Boone National Guard Center, Frankfort, KY 40601. Written substantive comments received at the above address within 30 days of this published notice will be addressed.

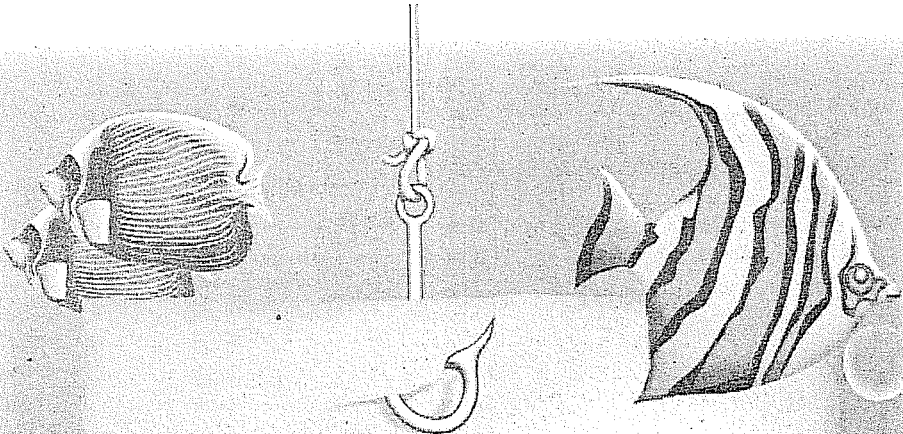
