COMMISSION STAFF'S FIRST REQUEST FOR INFORMATION
TO DUKE ENERGY KENTUCKY, INC.

Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Duke Energy Kentucky, Inc. ("Duke Kentucky") is to file with the Commission the original and six copies of the following information on or before July 15, 2011, with a copy to all parties of record. Responses to requests for information shall be appropriately bound, tabbed and indexed. Each response shall include the name of the witness responsible for responding to the questions related to the information provided.

Each response shall be answered under oath or, for representatives of a public or private corporation or a partnership or association or a governmental agency, be accompanied by a signed certification of the preparer or the person supervising the preparation of the response on behalf of the entity that the response is true and accurate to the best of that person's knowledge, information, and belief formed after a reasonable inquiry.

Duke Kentucky shall make timely amendment to any prior response if it obtains information which indicates that the response was incorrect when made or, though correct when made, is now incorrect in any material respect. For any request to which Duke Kentucky fails or refuses to furnish all or part of the requested information, Duke Kentucky shall provide a written explanation of the specific grounds for its failure to completely and precisely respond.

Careful attention shall be given to copied material to ensure that it is legible. When the requested information has been previously provided in this proceeding in the requested format, reference may be made to the specific location of that information in responding to this request. When applicable, the requested information shall be separately provided for total company operations and jurisdictional operations.

1. Refer to the Answer and Motion to Dismiss (“Answer”) filed on November 29, 2010, at paragraph 17. Duke Kentucky states that “. . . the higher bills it complains of are attributable in part to an increase in electric base rates (attributable to the roll-in of greater fuel adjustment clause expenses) which took effect in mid-2009 and an increase in natural gas rates which took effect in early 2010.” Explain how a roll-in of fuel costs to base rates, with a corresponding decrease to the fuel adjustment clause, would affect the total bill of a customer.

2. In its November 29, 2010 Answer, Duke Kentucky provided copies of Complainant’s bills as an attachment.

a. The bill for service from August 19 to September 21 was not included in the attachment. Provide a copy of the omitted bill.

b. The last bill provided by Duke Kentucky for the Complainant was for service through October 19, 2010. Provide a copy of all subsequent bills for the Complainant.
