KENTUCKY INDUSTRIAL UTILITY CUSTOMERS, INC'S RESPONSE IN SUPPORT OF MOTION TO CORRECT ORDER

On February 3, 2012, Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU"), moved the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") to issue an Order *nunc pro tunc* correcting its January 31, 2012 Order ("Final Order"). The Kentucky Industrial Utility Customers, Inc., ("KIUC") supports KU.

As noted by KU, the Final Order accepted the total revenue less fuel allocation methodology for non-residential customers in the Settlement Agreement in Case No. 2011-00161. Consistent with the terms of the Commission-approved Settlement Agreement in Case No. 2011-00161, KU proposed to allocate on the same basis both the incremental ECR amount to be rolled-into base rates and the existing amount of ECR revenues embedded in base rates. This is consistent with KIUC's understanding on how the roll-in would be done based upon representations made during the settlement negotiations in Case No. 2011-00161 and based upon KU's January 5, 2012 Supplemental Information Filing in this case. KIUC relied on this understanding.

The allocation of environmental surcharge costs for non-residential customers based on total revenue less fuel is reasonable. Accordingly, all environmental surcharge costs – both incremental and existing – should be allocated on the same basis.

THEREFORE, KIUC supports the instant motion.
