JOINT MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

East Kentucky Power Cooperative, Inc. ("EKPC") and Louisville Gas and Electric Company and Kentucky Utilities Company (collectively, "LG&E - KU"), by and through their respective counsel, move the Public Service Commission ("Commission") to extend the time for LG&E-KU to file their testimony or comments in this proceeding through and until October 1, 2012. As grounds for this joint motion, movants state that following the exchange of information between LGE-KU and EKPC, certain technical issues arose concerning the data. LG&E-KU and EKPC have diligently and in good faith discussed and resolved these technical issues. The resolution of the data issues, however, delayed LG&E-KU from undertaking its analysis and report, and a brief amount of additional time therefore is required for LG&E-KU to complete the analysis and prepare testimony.
