BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

GENERAL ARTICLE ONE

(1) City of Dry Ridge Ordinance No. 739-2008 regarding the licensing and sale of alcoholic beverages within the City of Dry Ridge as heretofore ordained on December 22, 2008, be and the same is hereby duly reaffirmed, readopted and re-ordained save as hereby and hereinafter amended.
