The Applicant, Kentucky Utilities Company (“KU”), respectfully states as follows:


1. The Post Office address of the principal office of Applicant is 220 West Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky 40202. KU is a Kentucky corporation authorized to do business in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
2. KU is a utility engaged in the business of supplying electric service in and to various cities and the inhabitants thereof within the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and has conducted such business for a number of years. The instant filing is made in accordance with Section 278.020(4) of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.
3. Receipt of the requested certificate will allow KU to pursue its bid on a new franchise for which the City of Leitchfield, Kentucky (the “City”) has solicited bids pursuant to resolution or ordinance and advertisement, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.
4. A certified copy of KU’s Articles of Incorporation is already on file with the Commission in Case No. 2010-00204 and is incorporated herein by reference pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 8(3).

5. There is and will continue to be a demand and need for electric service in the areas of the City subject to the franchise, and KU desires to obtain a franchise in accordance with the bidding protocol established by the City.

6. Should KU be successful in acquiring said franchise, it will file copies thereof with the Commission.

WHEREFORE, Kentucky Utilities Company asks that the Commission enter an Order granting to KU a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to bid for and acquire a franchise from the City on or before December 12, 2012.

COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY
CITY OF LEITCHFIELD

ORDINANCE NO. 2012-09

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A FRANCHISE FOR THE ERECTION, LAYING AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRIC FACILITIES AND APPURTENANT FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT IN, ALONG AND ACROSS THE PUBLIC WAYS, ROADS, STREETS, ALLEYS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES IN THE CITY OF LEITCHFIELD KENTUCKY; FOR FURNISHING AND SELLING ELECTRICITY BY MEANS OF SAID FACILITIES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF SAID FRANCHISE.

WHEREAS, the City of Leitchfield ("City") wishes to ensure that electric service continues to be furnished to its citizens in a reliable and efficient manner;

WHEREAS, the City is aware that the provision of such service requires the continued use of public streets, ways, alleys and other public places;

WHEREAS, the franchise granted to and acquired by Kentucky Utilities Company on April 5, 1993, under which that utility provided such service, will expire by its terms; April 5, 2013

WHEREAS, the City wishes to provide for the sale of a new franchise for the benefit of its citizenry, giving effect to Section 96.010 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED as follows:

Section 1. A franchise ("Franchise") to use the City's public rights-of-way, as described in the Franchise Agreement attached to this Ordinance, is hereby created.

Section 2. The Franchise created by this Ordinance shall be bid in accordance with the applicable requirements of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and Chapter 424 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, as well as any applicable City ordinances.

Section 3. The Franchise created by this Ordinance shall be awarded to the highest and best bidder as shall be determined by the City in its sole discretion. In awarding the Franchise, the City shall consider the technical, managerial, and financial qualifications of the bidder to perform its obligations under the Franchise.

Section 4. The winning bidder and the City shall negotiate, execute and be bound by a Franchise Agreement with terms identical to, or substantially identical to, the Franchise Agreement referenced in Section 1 above and attached hereto, such Agreement to contain terms "that are fair and reasonable to the City, to the purchaser of the Franchise and to the patrons of the utility" (KRS Section 96.010). Such Franchise Agreement shall take effect no earlier than 90 days after its execution, to allow the City and the winning bidder to develop appropriate procedures for identifying and reviewing the electric-consuming entities within the City's corporate limits.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 6. Should any section, clause, line, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance or the attached Agreement be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the same not affect the remainder of this Ordinance or the attached Agreement, as applicable.

Section 7. Time is of the essence in carrying out the terms and the provisions of this Ordinance and the Franchise created herein.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage and publication. Read at a meeting of the Leitchfield City Council on the 5th day of November, 2012; a second reading was held on the 19 day of NOVEMBER, 2012; said Ordinance was READ and APPROVED on the 19 day of NOVEMBER, 2012.

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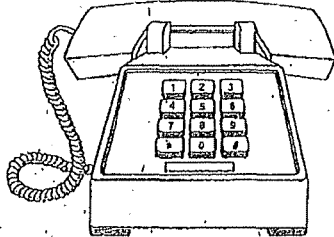

By virtue of a Judgment and Order of Sale entered on September 18, 2012, the Master Commissioner will on December 3, 2012 at 1:00 p.m., offer for sale the property described below. The property will be offered at public auction to the highest bidder on terms of TEN (10%) PERCENT down in the form of cash, cashier's check or certified check, and the balance on a credit of forty-five (45) days, secured by a bond with sufficient surety, bearing interest at the accruing interest rate of 12% per annum from date of sale until the purchase price is paid. The auction will be held at the newest judicial building located at 500 Carroll Gibson Boulevard, Leitchfield, Kentucky the following described property, to-wit:

A certain tract of land lying in Grayson County, Kentucky on the waters of Nolich River and bounded as follows:

Beginning at a stone in C. B. Hatfield's line; Thence North 218 yards to a stone corner; Thence E. about 350 Yds. to a stone, Eliza Fulkerson's corner; Thence with Fulkerson's line S. about 220 yards to a stone; Thence W. about 350 yards to the beginning corner, containing about 16 acres more or less. There is reserved a one half interest in the oil and mineral rights on the above boundary which has been sold.

Being the same land conveyed to Earl Puckett and Marie Puckett, his wife, from Denim Oldham and Carla Oldham, by deed of survivorship dated May 24, 1948 and recorded in Deed Book 40, Page 332, records of the Grayson County Clerk's Office. Earl Puckett died the 20th day of August, 1986 vesting all of his interest to his wife Marie Puckett. Thereafter Marie Puckett died testate on the 25th day of September, 2007, leaving the property to Mildred Nelson, Mary Nell Stewart, Ann Puckett, Kevin Puckett, and Tommy Jacobs, as evidenced by the Last Will and Testament of Marie Puckett and Affidavit of Heirship. See Affidavit of Heirship of record in Deed Book 403, Page 458, records of the Grayson County Clerk's Office and by the Last Will and Testament of Marie Puckett filed of record in Will Book AA, Page 497 records of the Grayson County Clerk's Office.

The real estate has been adjudged indivisible and will be sold as a whole, including all improvements. It will be sold subject to the real estate taxes for the current year, and also subject to all restrictions and easements of record. Neither the Court nor the Master Commissioner warrant title or condition of the subject property.

The purchaser will be required to make the down payment at the time of sale, payable to the order of the Master Commissioner in the form of cash, cashier's check or certified check. The purchaser will also be required to give bond for the balance of the purchase price with surety that is satisfactory to the Master Commissioner. The bond, payable to the Master Commissioner, will have the force and effect of a judgment bearing twelve (12%) percent interest from the date of sale. A lien will be retained on the property sold until the purchase money is fully paid.
