RESOLUTION OF THE U.S. 60 Water District, AUTHORIZING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NEW RATES, SUBMITTING NEW RATES TO THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION AND AUTHORIZING A REPRESENTATIVE TO SIGN ALL RELATED DOCUMENTS

WHEREAS, the Frankfort Electric and Water Plant Board has raised the wholesale cost of water and

WHEREAS, the Public Service Commission has approved the rate increase; and
