Bruce Smith, John Horne, Tom Smith, Richard Decker, Christopher Horne, Steve Hudson, Johnnie McCollum and Diana Clark were also present.

There was a review of the Aged Receivables.

Mr. Smith reported that the Brannon Crossing, Noland Farm Phase 5, and Noland Phase 6, 2nd Amended bond litigation is still ongoing. Before the necessary easements are signed by the Trinity Christian Academy, certain demands have been requested by the church sponsoring the school.

Mr. Smith reported that **Southland Christian Church** had responded back concerning the conveyance of the sewer line. SCC wanted to verify that the District could monitor the line at the same quality as LFUCG.

Diana presented the Sewage Treated Adjustment and tariff for a proposed increase of \$.07/1000 gals effective April 1st for all sewer customers. A notice will be sent to the Jessamine Co Fiscal Court and Mr. Horne will represent the District at the up-coming Fiscal Court meeting. A motion to approve the increase was made by Mr. Haws, seconded by Mr. Hall – approved.

There was a brief discussion on auditors for 2014.

A motion to approve the amended minutes of the February meeting was made by Mr. Hall, seconded by Mr. Haws – approved.

The motion to approve the February bills and pre-approval of contractual payables was made as a Water item.

The Commissioners were given the following reports for review: Income Statement and Balance Sheet.

Fiscal court approves items (CAR)

The Jessamine County Fiscal Court approved the second reading of planning and zoning amendment 3.75 in its Tuesday meeting. The ordinance deals with non-conforming lots.

In new business, the court approved the conservation district's amended budget for '18-'14 and the 2014 YMCA Jessamine Swims water-safety program.

The court accepted a Kentucky Board of Medical Services grant for \$10,000 for Jessamine EMS.

Engineer John Horne told the court that the sewer rate in the South. Eikhlorn Water was increased by 7 cents per 1,000 gallons by the Lexington-Fayette County government. The record will now reflect the changes.

In other business, the court approved the hire of Mary K. Lucas as a 911 Telecommunicator and the resignation of Suzanne Keely from full-time paramedic to part-time.

The court renewed lease agreements for properties on 102 S. First St. and 116 N. Main St. Suite 2.

Public meeting on 'Y' intersection set
