APPLICATION

The Applicant, Kentucky Utilities Company (“KU”), respectfully states as follows:

1. The Post Office address of the principal office of Applicant is 220 West Main Street, Louisville, Kentucky 40202. KU is a Kentucky corporation authorized to do business in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

2. KU is a utility engaged in the business of supplying electric service in and to various cities and the inhabitants thereof within the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and has conducted such business for a number of years. The instant filing is made in accordance with Section 278.020(4) of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

3. Receipt of the requested certificate will allow KU to pursue its bid on a new franchise for which the City of Burgin, Kentucky (the “City”) has solicited bids pursuant to resolution or ordinance and advertisement, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A.


4. A certified copy of KU’s Articles of Incorporation is already on file with the Commission in Case No. 2010-00204 and is incorporated herein by reference pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 14(2)(a).

5. There is and will continue to be a demand and need for electric service in the areas of the City subject to the franchise, and KU desires to obtain a franchise in accordance with the bidding protocol established by the City.

6. Should KU be successful in acquiring said franchise, it will file copies thereof with the Commission.

WHEREFORE, Kentucky Utilities Company asks that the Commission enter an Order granting to KU a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to bid for and acquire a franchise from the City on or before November 14, 2014.

COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY

ORDINANCE NO. 2014-10-14

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A FRANCHISE FOR THE ERECTION, LAYING AND MAINTENANCE OF ELECTRIC FACILITIES AND APPURTENANT FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT IN, ALONG AND ACROSS THE PUBLIC WAYS, ROADS, STREETS, ALLEYS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES IN THE CITY OF BURGIN, KENTUCKY: FOR FURNISHING AND SELLING ELECTRICITY BY MEANS OF SAID FACILITIES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF SAID FRANCHISE.

WHEREAS, the City of Burgin ("City") wishes to ensure that electric service continues to be furnished to its citizens in a reliable and efficient manner;

WHEREAS, the City is aware that the provision of such service requires the continued use of public streets, ways, alleys and other public places;

WHEREAS, the franchise granted to and acquired by Kentucky Utilities Company on December 5, 1994, under which that utility provided such service, will expire by its terms; December 5, 2014

WHEREAS, the City wishes to provide for the sale of a new franchise for the benefit of its citizenry, giving effect to Section 96.010 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED as follows:

Section 1. An exclusive franchise ("Franchise") to use the City's public rights-of-way, as described in the Franchise Agreement attached to this Ordinance, is hereby created.

Section 2. The Franchise created by this Ordinance shall be bid in accordance with the applicable requirements of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and Chapter 424 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, as well as any applicable City ordinances.

Section 3. The Franchise created by this Ordinance shall be awarded to the highest and best bidder as shall be determined by the City in its sole discretion. In awarding the Franchise, the City shall consider the technical, managerial, and financial qualifications of the bidder to perform its obligations under the Franchise.


Section 4. The winning bidder and the City shall negotiate, execute and be bound by a Franchise Agreement with terms identical to, or substantially identical to, the Franchise Agreement referenced in Section 1 above and attached hereto, such Agreement to contain terms “that are fair and reasonable to the City, to the purchaser of the Franchise and to the patrons of the utility” (KRS Section 96.010). Such Franchise Agreement shall take effect no earlier than 90 days after its execution, to allow the City and the winning bidder to develop appropriate procedures for identifying and reviewing the electric-consuming entities within the City’s corporate limits.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 6. Should any section, clause, line, paragraph, or part of this Ordinance or the attached Agreement be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the same shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance or the attached Agreement, as applicable.

Section 7. Time is of the essence in carrying out the terms and the provisions of this Ordinance and the Franchise created herein.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall become effective from and after its passage and publication. Read at a meeting of the Burgin City Council on the 9th day of September, 2014; a second reading was held on the 14th day of October, 2014; said Ordinance was READ and APPROVED on the 14th day of October, 2014.

INVITATION TO BID

The City of Harrodsburg is seeking bids to clean three lagoons at the Water Treatment Plant, 3025 Shakertown Road by excavation and disposal of material onsite. We will need the bidder to complete two lagoons by the end of February 2015, and the final lagoon by April 2015. The lagoons are approximately 100' x 200' each and consist of sediment deposited from wastewater treatment operations.

Bids should be broken down by price per lagoon. The bidder must be able to provide their own equipment and install erosion control best management practices (BMP's) such as earth berms, silt fence, etc.

Bidders must have liability insurance as well as a current City of Harrodsburg business license.

Anyone interested in bidding should turn in sealed bids by Friday, November 14th at 3:00 p.m. and will be opened / approved at the City Commission Meeting at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, November 24th.

An Ordinance amending provisions of the City of Harrodsburg Ordinance # 2006-13.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Harrodsburg desires to amend a portion of the Classification plan, Compensation plan, and Job Description of Ordinance 2006-13.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it enacted by the City of Harrodsburg, Kentucky, that a portion of the Ordinance under "job classifications/descriptions for Water Treatment Plant Operator II", be established as follows:

Class Title
Water Treatment Plant Class II / Operator in Training

Characteristics of the Class
Under general direction of the Superintendent or Class IIIA or IVA Water Plant Operator, Assisting in performing specialized work related to the operation and maintenance of the city's Water Treatment Plant. Performs related work as required,

Assists in maintaining and operations of a Class IVA Water Treatment Plant in compliance with all applicable statutes and regulations. Assists in conducting required testing of water and prepares/submits accurate reports to supervisor. Assists in preventive maintenance on plant and equipment, making repairs and adjustments as necessary for proper operations. Add chemicals in accordance with prescribed standards. Performs custodial work in the cleaning and maintenance of plant and grounds. Maintain accurate and complete records. Performs routine clerical task associated with job responsibilities. Employee is subject to emergency call back. Performs other related duties as required.

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance was approved by the City Commissioners of Harrodsburg on the 27 day of October, 2014.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE 2014-17

An Ordinance amending provisions of the City of Harrodsburg Ordinance # 2006-13.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Harrodsburg desires to amend a portion of the Classification plan, Compensation plan, and Policies and Procedures of Ordinance 2006-13.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it enacted by the City of Harrodsburg, Kentucky, that a portion of the Ordinance on page 49 of 73 pages under "Worker's Compensation Leave;", be amended as follows:

7. Employees receiving Worker's Compensation benefits shall receive no pay from the city. When an employee is off work on Workers Compensation, Family Medical Leave and Workers Compensation must run concurrently. When out on Workers Compensation for 12 weeks or longer, the employee will have exhausted all of their FMLA entitlement for this event. While taking FMLA in conjunction with Workers Compensation the employee will not be paid for sick, vacation, or holiday time, they will only receive workers compensation benefits.

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance was approved by the City Commissioners of Harrodsburg on the 27th day of October, 2014.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage, approval and publication as required by law.
