On Friday, February 6, it was brought to my attention that I made a mistake in completing Appendix B of my application for Appointment to the Mountain Water District. In response to the questions concerning any past business transactions I had with Mountain Water District. I listed "none". It appears that a company I owned, E&D Mountain View Construction, Inc., did have several contracts with the District in 2001, for water line extensions in Mouthcard and Buskirk areas of Pike County. It was reported in the newspaper that these five contracts totaled about 2.5 million dollars. I closed out the waterline business in 2003, and did not keep any records of the projects. The business was run by a superintendent who oversaw the day-to-day activities. It was also one of the smaller companies I had at the time. I truly had no memory of these contracts, as most of our work was done in West Virginia.

I also had two other large projects that occupied my attention during that time period. In 1999, I started a large coal mining operation at Thacker, which was subsequently sold out in 2004. I also bought the Logan Mall in 2001. This was a 35 million dollar project that consumed me over an eighteen-month period.


The next mistake raised by the newspaper concern listing family members that are employed by the District. It is my understanding that the District has only one employee, and everyone else is employed by the Districts' contractor, Utility Management Group. I did not think about the Commissioners being considered

employees. My brother-in-law, Ancie Casey, is currently serving as a Commissioner. Mr. Casey has never been involved in any of my business dealings. I don't think the fact that we are in-laws would influence any of our decisions concerning the District.

In closing, I apologize for my error, and would ask that you favorably consider my application.
