O R D E R

On April 11, 1983, East Laurel Water District ("East Laurel") filed its application with the Public Service Commission ("Commission") seeking approval of a purchased water adjustment clause and authority to adjust its rates in accordance with that clause. On April 15, 1983, the Commission ordered that additional information be filed, which East Laurel did on April 22, 1983. However, due to errors in the filing, on April 28, 1983, the Commission ordered that corrected data be filed. The corrected information has been filed, and the record is now complete.

The Commission, having reviewed the evidence of record and being advised, is of the opinion and finds that:

(1) The purchased water adjustment clause sought by East Laurel is in compliance with 807 KAR 5:067, Purchased Water Adjustment Clause, is in the best interest of the public, and should be approved.

(2) East Laurel purchases water from the Wood Creek Water District ("Wood Creek"). Wood Creek increased the wholesale cost of water from \$.65 to \$.80 per 1,000 gallons

pursuant to an Order of the Commission in Case No. 8643, The Application of Wood Creek Water District, Laurel County, Kentucky, dated March 14, 1983.

(3) The calculations made by East Laurel are incorrect in that they are based on purchases and sales for the 12-month period ending December 31, 1982, which is more than 90 days prior to the date of filing. However, East Laurel provided information as to purchases and sales for January, February and March, 1983, which is within 90 days of the date of filing as prescribed by 807 KAR 5:067(1)(b). The Commission is of the opinion that the purchased water adjustment should be based on the most recent information available and has, therefore, based its calculations on the 12-month period ending March 31, 1983.

(4) The statement of water purchased and sold filed by East Laurel shows that its line loss for the 12-month period ending March 31, 1983, is approximately 11.5 percent which is less than the maximum of 15 percent allowed by the Commission.

(5) The total allowable increase in purchased water costs is \$10,814 resulting in a purchased water adjustment in the amount of \$.17 per 1,000 gallons.

(6) The financial exhibits filed by East Laurel indicate that it cannot absorb an increase of this magnitude in the wholesale cost of water.

(7) The revised tariff sheets filed by East Laurel reflecting its proposed rates include minimum bills and usage

levels for meters larger than 5/8-inch X 3/4-inch which differ from those allowed by the Commission's Order in Case No. 6666, The Application of East Laurel Water District, dated April 20, 1977, establishing rates to be charged by East Laurel. No application or tariff filing has been made by East Laurel requesting approval of the minimum bill rates. These rates should, therefore, be denied. Further, the Commission should investigate the matter for the purpose of determining whether minimum bill rates not previously approved by the Commission are being charged by East Laurel.

(8) The purchased water adjustment in the amount of \$.17 per 1,000 gallons and the rates in Appendix A are fair, just and reasonable and should be approved.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the purchased water adjustment clause sought by East Laurel be and it hereby is approved effective on and after the date of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the proposed minimum bills and usage levels for meters larger than 5/8-inch X 3/4-inch be and they hereby are denied.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the purchased water adjustment in the amount of \$.17 per 1,000 gallons and the rates in Appendix A be and they hereby are approved for service rendered on and after the date of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that for the purpose of future application of the purchased water adjustment clause of East Laurel the base rate for purchased water shall be:

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that within 30 days of the date of this Order, East Laurel shall file with the Commission its revised tariff sheets setting out the purchased water adjustment clause and the rates approved herein.

APPENDIX TO AN ORDER OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE
COMMISSION IN CASE NO. 8188-1 DATED MAY 23, 1983

The following rates are prescribed for customers served by East Laurel Water District. All other rates and charges not specifically mentioned herein shall remain the same as those in effect under authority of the Commission prior to the effective date of this Order.
