

**Q-1.** Provide for the Stillhouse Mine No. 2

- a. the horsepower
- b. the load factor

**A-1. a.** The horsepower inventory for the Stillhouse No. 2 Mine is as follows:

Mobile Roof Support	200.0
Roof Bolters	200.0

Cont. Miner	790.0
Feeders	400.0
Discharge Pumps	165.5
Total	4,290.5

- b. Although there is a meter for the 69 Kv tap (at Lynch Substation) where retail power is delivered to the customer's distribution system, there are no other meters in use. The customer is, therefore, unable to provide the load factor for Stillhouse Mine No. 2. For purposes of accounting, the total charges for electricity purchased from KU are allocated / prorated between mining operations based upon horsepower of electric powered equipment in use at each operating unit.


