Dear Ms. Sturgeon:

The Public Service Commission has received the Petition for Confidential Protection you filed on September 1, 2011 on behalf of Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU") to protect certain information filed with the Commission as confidential pursuant to Section 7 of 807 KAR 5:001 and KRS 61.878. The information you seek to have treated as confidential is identified as being contained in KU's Responses to Commission 2nd Data Request Nos. 2(c), 2(d), 6, 14(a) and 32(b) and (d). The information is more particularly described as (No. 2c) – KU's plans with regard to additional generation capacity; (No. 2d) – electronic response containing projected costs of labor, fuel, and other sensitive information; (No. 6) – calculations computing the average dispatch costs of each unit; (No. 14a) – allocations regarding expected outputs of each unit; and (No. 32 b and d) – fuel cost data.

Your justification for having the Commission handle this material as confidential is that the public disclosure of the information would compromise KU's competitive position in the industry and result in an unfair commercial advantage to its competitors.


Based on a review of the information and pursuant to KRS 61.878 and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7, the Commission has determined that the information requested to be held confidential is of a proprietary nature, which if publicly disclosed would permit an unfair commercial advantage to KU's competitors. Therefore, the information requested to be treated as confidential **meets the criteria for confidential protection** and will be

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maintained as a nonpublic part of the Commission's file in this case. The procedure for usage of confidential materials during formal proceedings may be found at Section 7(8) of 807 KAR 5:001.

If the information becomes publicly available or no longer warrants confidential treatment, Kentucky Utilities Company is required by Section 8(9)(a) of KAR 5:001 to inform the Commission so that the information may be placed in the public record.
