The Governing Body of Boyd County will conduct a public comment period to consider amending the Area's Solid Waste Management Plan. The proposal was submitted to the Kentucky Energy and Environmental Cabinet, Division of Waste Management, in accordance with KRS 224.43.340 and 401 KAR 49.001, Section 4. If approved, the amendment would revise the Boyd County Area Solid Waste Management Plan by:

Modifying Chapter 3, Disposal page 8, to add a great-than-one acre construction/demolition debris landfill to be located 3,400 feet northwest of the intersection of US 23 and KY 168



Students want watch leader who shot teen arrested

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP)—College students around Florida rallied Monday to demand the arrest of a neighborhood watch captain who shot an unarmed black teen last month, though authorities may be hamstrung by a state law that allows people to defend themselves with deadly force.

Police have described the man who fired the shot, 28-year-old George Zimmerman, as white; his family says he is Hispanic and is not racist.

Zimmerman claims he shot 17-year-old Trayvon Martin last month in self-defense during a confrontation in a gated community in Sanford.

Students had rallies on

the campus of Florida A&M University in Tallahassee and outside the Seminole County Criminal Justice Center, where prosecutors are reviewing the case to determine if charges should be filed. The students demanded Zimmerman's arrest.

Zimmerman spotted Martin as he was patrolling his neighborhood on a rainy evening last month and called 911 to report a suspicious person. Against the advice of the 911 dispatcher, Zimmerman then followed Martin, who was walking home from a convenience store with a bag of Skittles in his pocket.

"I don't think a man who exited his vehicle after the 911 dispatcher told him to

stay inside the car can claim self-defense," Carl McPhail, a 28-year-old Barry University law school student, said at the Sanford rally.

The case has garnered national attention and civil rights activist Al Sharpton and radio host Michael Baisden planned to lead another rally Thursday in Sanford.

U.S. Rep. Corrine Brown, D-Fla., along with members of the Congressional Black Caucus and the Congressional Hispanic Caucus, have asked that the U.S. Department of Justice to review the case, and White House spokesman Jay Carney said Monday during a briefing officials there were aware of what happened.

"Our thoughts and

prayers go out to Trayvon Martin's family," Carney said. "But obviously we're not going to wade into a local law enforcement matter."

Late Monday, Florida Gov. Rick Scott directed the state Department of Law Enforcement to help local authorities in their investigation. The governor said in a memo to department Commissioner Gerald Bradley that the circumstances surrounding the death "have caused significant concern within the Sanford community and the state."


