COMMISSION STAFF'S THIRD REQUEST FOR INFORMATION
TO GRAYSON RURAL ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE CORPORATION

Grayson Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation ("Grayson"), pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, is to file with the Commission the original and seven copies of the following information, with a copy to all parties of record. The information requested herein is due within ten days of the date of this request. Responses to requests for information shall be appropriately bound, tabbed and indexed. Each response shall include the name of the witness responsible for responding to the questions related to the information provided.

Each response shall be answered under oath or, for representatives of a public or private corporation or a partnership or association or a governmental agency, be accompanied by a signed certification of the preparer or person supervising the preparation of the response on behalf of the entity that the response is true and accurate to the best of that person's knowledge, information, and belief formed after a reasonable inquiry.

Grayson shall make timely amendment to any prior response if it obtains information which indicates that the response was incorrect when made or, though correct when made, is now incorrect in any material respect. For any request to which

Grayson fails or refuses to furnish all or part of the requested information, Grayson shall provide a written explanation of the specific grounds for its failure to completely and precisely respond.

Careful attention should be given to copied material to ensure that it is legible. When the requested information has been previously provided in this proceeding in the requested format, reference may be made to the specific location of that information in responding to this request. When applicable, the requested information shall be separately provided for total company operations and jurisdictional operations.

1. Refer to Grayson's response to Item 1.a. of Commission Staff's Second Request for Information ("Staff's Second Request"). The response states that 93 customers are currently taking service under Schedule 3, but identifies the rate classes to which only four customers would be transferred if Grayson's request to make Schedule 3 a rider is approved. Confirm that the remaining 89 customers would be transferred to the Schedule 1 – Farm and Home rate class. If this cannot be confirmed, state the classes to which the 89 customers would be transferred and the number of customers transferring to each class.


2. Refer to Grayson's response to Item 1.b. of Staff's Second Request.

a. Identify the two customers referenced in the response that would be transferred to the Small Commercial rate class.

b. Identify the two customers referenced in the response that would be transferred to the General Service rate class.

c. Using 2013 billing determinants, provide the amount and percentage of increase that each of the four customers would receive if transferred. Include in the response supporting calculations.

d. Explain why each increase calculated in 2.c. above is reasonable.
