incorporated into its base rates.
Response) Given the volatility of the Environmental Surcharge and ongoing
changes to environmental regulations continuing to impact the costs to be recovered
through the mechanism, Big Rivers is not requesting that any environmental
surcharge amounts be incorporated into base rates at this time. Big Rivers believes
that keeping the Environmental Surcharge separate from its base rates provides
better transparency for its Member Owners, allowing them and their Members (the
end-use consumers) to more clearly understand what environmental regulatory
charges are being included on their bills. Also, Big Rivers' Member Owners have
noted their end-use consumers of electricity are extremely confused by base rate
changes arising from incorporating surcharges and, consequently, associate these
surcharge 'roll-ins' with permanent increases or decreases in electricity costs.
