ORDER

The Kentucky Rural Water Association (“KRWA”) has applied for accreditation and approval of its 2018 Management Conference, held on February 21–22, 2018, in Bowling Green, Kentucky. KRWA requests that the program be approved for 12 hours of continuing education credit. The program consists of 12 separate presentations, each one hour in length, which address management and regulatory issues affecting water utilities.

Having reviewed KRWA’s application, the Commission finds that the presentations at the training will enhance a water district commissioner’s understanding of his or her responsibilities and duties, and the Commission accredits the 2018 Management Conference and approves it for up to 12 credit hours of water district management training.

The Commission notes that, while it has approved this program for water district commissioner training that has already occurred, the Commission, in Case No. 2018-00085<sup>1</sup>, has established new guidelines for receiving accreditation for water district commissioner training. All future applications for accreditation for water district

commissioner training must conform to the requirements of Case No. 2018-00085 or the Commission will not approve the application.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The 2018 Management Conference held February 21–22, 2018, in Bowling Green, Kentucky, is accredited and approved for a maximum of 12 credit hours of water district management training.

2. KRWA shall retain a record of all water district commissioners attending the accredited and approved presentations.

3. Within 30 days of this Order, KRWA shall file with the Commission:

a. A sworn statement attesting that the accredited instruction was performed;

b. A description of any changes in the presenters or the proposed curriculum that occurred after KRWA's application;

c. The name of each attending water district commissioner, his or her water district, and the number of hours that he or she attended;

d. A copy of any written material given to water commissioners attending the presentations; and

e. Documents indicating whether the Kentucky Board of Certification of Water Treatment and Distribution System Operators approved the training for continuing education credit.
