(2) Beginning in the second full billing month following the date of this Order, LG&E shall decrease its jurisdictional environmental revenue requirement by \$654,925 for two months. (3) Beginning in the second full billing month following the date of this Order, LG&E shall use an overall rate of return on capital of 7.24 percent, a tax gross-up factor of 0.64, a return on equity rate of 1 0.25 percent, and an overall grossed-up return of 10.43 percent in all future monthly environmental surcharge filings unless directed otherwise by the Commission.
