07/31/26 Final Order Entered: 1. Duke Kentucky's Application for Declaratory Order is approved, in part, and denied, in part. 2. Amounts paid by Duke Kentucky to the 25 customers who will lose gas service upon abandonment of the TC Energy Line and who cannot be readily connected to Duke Kentucky's distribution system for the purpose of converting the properties of said customers to an alternative fuel source are, subject to a prudence review by the Commission as discussed herein above, recoverable expenses. 3. Duke Kentucky's alternative request for approval to extend its pipeline infrastructure to connect all affected customers to its distribution system in the ordinary course of business and without obtaining a CPCN is denied without prejudice. 4. Duke Kentucky's request for a declaration that the conversion costs are properly classified as removal costs "for the removal of existing services" pursuant to FERC's Code of Federal Regulation, Title 18, Chapter I, Subchapter C, Part 101, No. 10 is denied. 5. Duke Kentucky is authorized to establish a regulatory asset for the costs to convert existing customers to alternative fuel sources in relation to the abandonment of a transmission line by TC Energy. 6. Duke Kentucky shall provide documentation of the payments and testimony regarding the reasonableness of the payments in the rate case in which it requests recovery of the regulatory asset in rates.
