IV. Summary of Comments and Responses:

(1) Subject Matter. Section 1 and Section 8(2) Notice and Electronic Billing

(a) Commenter: Kendrick R. Riggs (Louisville Gas and Electric Company and Kentucky Utilities Company)

Comment: The proposed regulation does not address the issue of notices with electronic billings. Utilities that engage in electronic billing should be permitted the option of providing notice of a proposed rate adjustment electronically with its electronic bills. Section 1 of this regulation should be amended to add a definition of "Customer bill", and Section 8(2) should be revised to allow electronic transmission of notice with customer bills. A new subsection should be added to Section 8(2) allowing notice to be promulgated to the customer, if the customer has consented in writing, in an electronic message to the customer, a portable document format attachment, or a hyperlink to the utility's website.

(b) Response: Revisions to Section 1 and Section 8(2) are beyond the scope of the Commission's revisions at this time. Although this comment may have merit, it deserves more consideration and review by all affected utilities and interested parties.

#### V. Summary of the Statement of Consideration and Action Taken By Promulgating Administrative Body

The Public Service Commission has responded to the comments from the public comment period regarding the proposed amendments to 807 KAR 5:011 and will not be amending the administrative regulation.
