PSC To Give Annual Update on Natural Gas Prices *Oct. 30 event will be broadcast live on the Web*

FRANKFORT, Ky. (Oct. 26, 2009) – Natural gas prices during the 2009-2010 heating season will be discussed during an Oct. 30, 2009, news briefing at the Kentucky Public Service Commission (PSC).
