ORDER

Preface

On March 29, 1979, the Lexington South Elkhorn Water District, hereinafter sometimes referred to as the Applicant, filed with this Commission⁽¹⁾ its request seeking an increase in water rates and service connection fees to be charged by the District. The rate increase sought by the Applicant would increase annual revenues by approximately \$29,966 over testyear operations.

The case was set for hearing at the Commission's offices in Frankfort, Kentucky, June 27, 1979. All parties of interest were notified with the Consumer Protection Division of the Attorney General's Office permitted to intervene in the matter. At the hearing, certain requests for additional information were made by the Commission staff. This information has been filed, and the entire matter is now considered to be fully submitted for a final determination by this Commission.

Test Period

For the purpose of determining the reasonableness of the proposed rates, the twelve-month period ending December 31, 1978, has been utilized as the "Test-Year". Adjustments, where found significant and reasonable, have been included to reflect more current operating conditions.

Findings in This Matter

The Commission, after consideration of all the evidence of

record and being advised, if of the opinion and finds:

- 1. That the existing rates charged by the Applicant, provided annual revenues of approximately \$73, 262 from an average of 465 customers receiving water service during the test-year ending December 31, 1978.
- 2. That the Applicant's annual proforms expenses, including those for depreciation and interest are estimated to be approximately \$91,991.

That the rates prescribed and set forth in Appendix "A", attached hereto, are the fair, just and reasonable rates to be charged by the Lexington South Elkhorn Water District. Further, that these rates should provide annual revenues of approximately \$91,791 from 465 customers and the addition thereto of \$6,238 other income (2) should result in total annual revenues of \$98,029, which should provide for: proforma expenses including depreciation and interest, servicing of the debt, and the accumulation of a reasonable surplus for compliance with bond ordinance requirements. The Commission further concludes that test-year and proforma revenues and expenses can be summarized as shown in Appendix "B", attached hereto and made a part hereof.

- 4. That the rates proposed by the Applicant are unfair, unjust, and unreasonable in that they would produce revenues in excess of those found reasonable herein and should be denied.
- 5. That water lost in the Applicant's distribution system was approximately twenty-three (23) percent of the water purchased during the test year. Further, that the Applicant should establish and maintain an ongoing program for detection and correction of leaks in its distribution system and file bimonthly reports with this Commission until such time as such losses have been reduced to fifteen (15) percent or less for three (3) consecutive reporting periods.
- 6. That according to Kentucky Revised Statutes Chapter 74.361, the Kentucky General Assembly has determined that the reduction in the number of water districts and associations operating in the Commonwealth is in the public interest, "in that mergers of such Districts will tend to eliminate wasteful duplication of costs and efforts, result in a sounder and more businesslike degree of management, and ultimately result

in greater economies, less cost, and higher degree of service to the general public..." Therefore, the Commission further finds that the Applicant should investigate the possibilities of merger with the other water utilities operating in this area, and report to this Commission the findings of their investigation within ninety (90) days of the date of this Order.

ORDERS IN THIS MATTER

The Commission, on the basis of the matters hereinbefore set forth, and the evidentiary record in this case:

HEREBY ORDERS that the rates prescribed and set forth in Appendix "A", attached hereto be and the same are hereby fixed as fair, just, and reasonable rates of the Applicant to become effective for services rendered on and after the date of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the rates sought by the Applicant be and the same are hereby denied.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Applicant establish and maintain a program for detection and correction of leaks in its distribution system and file bimonthly reports with this Commission until such time as these losses have been reduced to fifteen (15) percent or less of the quantity of water purchased for three (3) consecutive reporting periods.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Applicant investigate the possibilities of merger with the other water utilities operating in this area and make a written report of the findings of said investigation to this Commission within ninety (90) days of the date of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Applicant shall file with this Commission, within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order its tariff sheets setting forth the rates approved herein. Further, that a copy of the Applicant's "Rules and Regulations" for providing service to its customers shall be filed with said tariff sheets.

The following rates and charges are hereby prescribed for all the customers served by the Lexington South Elkhorn Water District. All other rates and charges not mentioned specifically herein shall remain the same as those in effect prior to the date of this Order.

All meters shall be read to the nearest one hundred gallons each month.

The monthly bill for a customer served by a 5/8" x 3/4" meter shall be \$8.00 for metered usages of zero (0) to two thousand (2,000) gallons. The additional charge for usage in excess of two thousand gallons shall be computed to the nearest one hundred (100) gallons of usage on the basis of the above unit costs per one thousand (1,000) gallons. Monthly bills for customers served by meters larger than 5/8" x 3/4" shall be computed in a similar manner with the total bill being either the minimum bill for that meter, or the summation of the minimum bill and the cost of any additional gallonage to the nearest one hundred (100) gallons.

- (2) Applicants request for \$7,200 in funds for E.P.A. Monitoring has been reduced to \$5,475 in accordance with the terms of the contract for the providing of the monitoring.
- (3) Applicants request for \$1,500 in leak detection and repair has been amortized over a three (3) year period since this extraordinary repair expense is in addition to normal maintenance and repair.
- (4) All of the above noted expenses were reduced to "Test-Year". The increases requested by the Applicant were speculative, at best, and were not considered by the Commission to be reasonable known, and measurable adjustment, to the test-year and were therefore, denied.
- (5) Applicants request for the inclusion of bond principal payment as an annual expense has been disallowed since this cost has been considered in the amount allowed as a net surplus before debt retirement.


