ORDER

On January 30, 1980 the Commission received a letter from Western Kentucky Gas Company (Appendix "A") stating, among other things, that as a result of conservation measures by its customers and additional supplies made available by Texas Gas Transmission Corporation and Tennessee Gas Transmission Company, more gas is now available than is required by present customers. Accordingly the letter states that the Company intends to extend acceptance of customers under its Controlled Attachment Program to include Priorities 4, 5 and 6. These Priorities are:

- 4. Essential agricultural uses.
- 5. Commercial establishments with peak day use over 50 mcf.
- 6. Industrial process and feedstock uses.

New industrial customers would be offered service under a "Seller's Option" tariff and volumes would be subject to reductions and interruption on both a daily and seasonal basis prior to the interruption of customers on any other rate schedule.

The Commission having considered the matter and being advised hereby ORDERS That the tariff, PSC No. 15, Sheet No. 8-C (Seller's Option Rate SO) be and it hereby is suspended for a period of five (5) months from and after February 21, 1980.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That this matter be and it hereby is set for hearing on March 12, 1980, 1:30 p.m., Fastern Standard Time, in the Commission's offices at Frankfort, Kentucky.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That nothing contained herein shall prevent the Commission from entering further Orders in this matter

in the event the proceedings in this case shall be terminated by final Order and/or otherwise prior to the termination of the five month period of suspension.

Dear Mr. Heman:

On September 5, 1973, in Case No. 5845 the Commission approved the Company's Controlled Attachment Program, which permitted the Company to accept new customers on a priority basis as gas supply became available. This program was revised effective March 21, 1979, in order to recognize the effect of the Natural Gas Policy Act of 1978 which gave high priority status to schools, hospitals and similar institutions and also elevated the priority status of essential agricultural users. This revision was filed with the Commission in First Revised Sheet No. 18 of the Company's tariff.

In August of 1979 the Company advised the Commission that it had, effective fugust 1, 1979, extended its Controlled Attachment Program to accept rew customers through Priority 3. This action was taken to protect the Company's high priority entitlement status with its interstate pipelines.

As a result of conservation measures by its customers and additional supply made available by Texas Gas and Tennessee Gas, the Company currently has more gas available than is required by its present customers. This excess supply position is expected to prevail for at least several seasons. The Company therefore intends to extend acceptance of customers under its Controlled Attachment Program to include Priorities 4.5 and 6. However, in order to fully protect its present customers, new industrial customers will be offered service under a "Seller's Option" tariff. This tariff is the same as the Company's Large Volume Rate G-2, except that volumes under this service are subject to reductions and interruption on both a daily and seasonal basis prior to interruption of customers on any other rate schedule. In compliance with an amended order of the Commission issued February 7, 1974 in Case No. 5845, any investment required to affect a sale under this tariff will be at the expense of the buyer.
