ORDER

On August 16, 1979 the Commission received a letter from Mrs. Angie Many, Stanton, Kentucky concerning her efforts to obtain telephone service from South Central Bell Telephone Company (South Central Bell). Mrs. Many discussed her personal need for service at her residence which is approximately 4 miles east of Nada on Highway 77 in the Daniel Boone National Forest and the inavailability of telephone service in the general area.

After further correspondence on June 9, 1980, the Commission received a letter from South Central Bell advising that the construction project needed to place cable in the area would cost \$42,000 and that under Section A-5 of its tariff those desiring service would be required to pay the cost of construction. Applicants for initial service would be charged their appropriate share of the cost of providing service.

The Commission, having considered the correspondence and being advised, on its own Motion, hereby ORDERS that this matter be and it hereby is set for hearing on the 12th day of March, 1981, at 2:30 p.m., Eastern Standard Time, in the Commission's offices at Frankfort, Kentucky.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That South Central Bell Telephone Company shall appear at the hearing and present testimony relative to this matter.
