ORDER

On October 30, 1979, the Energy Regulatory Commission, predecessor to the Public Service Commission, received the application of Best Western Continental Inn ("Applicant") for an exemption from the prohibition on the continued use of natural gas in existing outdoor lighting under Section 402 of the Federal Industrial Power Plant and Fuel Use Act of 1978.

The Commission, after further consideration of all the evidence of record and being fully advised, is of the opinion and finds that:

- (1) The Applicant has published the public notice required by 807 KAR 5:035E, Section 5.
- (2) Neither the Applicant nor any other interested person has requested a hearing pursuant to 807 KAR 5:036E, Section 6.
- (3) Proper notice was sent to the natural gas supplier, Western Kentucky Gas Company, requesting continued gas light service pending this determination.
- (4) The Applicant has met all other requirements contained in 807 KAR 5:036E and Section 402 of the Power Plant and Industrial Fuel Use Act of 1978 for obtaining an exemption under the regulation.

The Commission, on the basis of the above-stated findings, ORDERS that Best Western Continental Inn, Bowling Green, Kentucky, be and hereby is granted authority for continued use of the existing natural gas outdoor lighting as specified in the application and supplied by Western Kentucky Gas Company.
