O R D E R

On July 9, 1982, the Western Union Telegraph Company ("Western Union") filed with the Public Service Commission ("Commission") a proposed tariff cancelling its Tariff No. 1. The services principally involved are Telex and TWX teletypewriter exchange record services and its basic Public Message (telegram) record services.

These services are primarily interstate in nature.

The Commission finds that further investigation will be necessary to determine the reasonableness of the proposed tariff. However, such investigation cannot be completed prior to the proposed effective date of the tariff.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the proposed tariff filing be and is suspended from the proposed effective date of August 18, 1982 for a period not to exceed five months.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that nothing herein shall prevent the Commission from entering additional orders in this matter.
