ORDER

On October 9, 1984, the Commission entered an Order granting the Harrison County Water Association ("Harrison") a certificate of public convenience and necessity for a waterworks improvement project. The Order also approved the financing for this project.

On January 3, 1985, Harrison filed construction plans for the extension of lines to serve an additional 35 customers and requested approval of this project. Supplemental information concerning this construction was filed on February 6 and March 4, 1985.

SUMMARY

The Commission, after considering all supplemental information and being advised, is of the opinion and finds that:

1. Public convenience and necessity require that the supplemental construction be performed and that a certificate of public convenience and necessity be granted, with the exception of the water main extension on Jones Lane.

The proposed construction for Jones Lane, which is included in Case No. 9253, the Application of the Harrison County Water Association, Inc., for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity, will be addressed by a separate Order.

- 2. The financing for the supplemental work was approved by the Commission's Order entered October 9, 1984.
- 3. The Commission's Order entered October 9, 1984, should be affirmed in all other respects.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Harrison be and it hereby is granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to proceed with the construction as set forth in the supplemental information herein approved.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission's Order entered October 9, 1984, be and it hereby is affirmed in all other respects.
