ORDER

On December 28, 1984, Farm Fresh Foods, Inc., ("Parm Fresh") filed a complaint against General Telephone Company of Kentucky ("General"). The complaint alleges that General refused to accept Farm Fresh's application for telephone service. General answered the complaint on January 24, 1985. It asserts that telephone service is not being denied Farm Fresh, but is being conditioned on the completion of an application form by the owner of Farm Fresh, Walter Callihan, a personal guarantee from Mr. Callihan to pay the telephone account of Walter Callihan, Inc., a written agreement by Mr. Callihan to make installment payments to pay off the current indebtedness of Walter Callihan, Inc., and a separate cash deposit as security for reestablishing an account for Mr. Callihan under the name of Farm Fresh Foods, Inc.

The issues raised in this complaint are similar to those raised in two previous complaints filed by Mr. Callihan against General in which the Commission found General's offer to provide service under the certain conditions fair, just and reasonable. General has offered to accept those same conditions in this case, which the Commission finds reasonable.

Because the issues in the case are so similar to the ones raised in Cases 7425, The Complaint of Walter Callihan Against General Telephone Company; and 8234, Little Sandy Packing Company and Walter Callihan, Inc. Against General Telephone Company, there is no new matter raised which the Commission feels merits a hearing or further action.

Therefore, after a review of the record, IT IS ORDERED that the complaint is dismissed.
