


The issues raised in this complaint are similar to those raised in two previous complaints filed by Mr. Callihan against General in which the Commission found General's offer to provide service under the certain conditions fair, just and reasonable. General has offered to accept those same conditions in this case, which the Commission finds reasonable.

Because the issues in the case are so similar to the ones raised in Cases 7425, The Complaint of Walter Callihan Against General Telephone Company; and 8234, Little Sandy Packing Company and Walter Callihan, Inc. Against General Telephone Company, there is no new matter raised which the Commission feels merits a hearing or further action.

Therefore, after a review of the record, IT IS ORDERED that the complaint is dismissed.
