ORDER

On May 9, 1989, Western Mason Water District ("Western Mason") filed a letter requesting approval to deviate from its current billing cycle. Western Mason has requested that it be allowed to bill its customers for one three-month period, that being April, May and June 1989. Western Mason, in accordance with its approved tariff, currently bills its customers every two months and under the present billing cycle is required to estimate the January billings in order to complete its year-end reports. Beginning in July 1989, under Western Mason's proposal, the billing would revert to the normal two-month billing cycle enabling Western Mason to finish its billing in the calendar year 1989.

The Commission is of the opinion and finds that Western Mason should be allowed to deviate from its tariff and bill its customers for one three-month period for April, May and June 1989. On July 1, 1989, Western Mason shall return to its approved two month billing cycle.

Western Mason shall notify its customers of this approved billing change and furnish a copy of such notice to the Commission.
