ORDER

This matter arising upon petition of AmeriCall Systems of Louisville ("AmeriCall") filed December 20, 1989 pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7, for confidential protection of financial and network information, and it appearing to this Commission as follows:

AmeriCall seeks to protect as confidential financial and network information contained in Exhibits A, B, C, and D filed with the Commission pursuant to its Order of December 8, 1989. In support of its petition, AmeriCall relies upon the allegations made in an earlier petition filed October 27, 1989, that requested confidential protection of material which AmeriCall states is similar to the material sought to be protected by this petition. No other basis is set forth in this petition for granting confidentiality.

Petitions for confidentiality must each be supported and evaluated on their own merits with the grounds relied upon by the petitioner fully set out in the petition. Since the petition filed on December 20, 1989 does not set forth any basis for protecting the information from disclosure, the petition cannot be granted.

This Commission being otherwise sufficiently advised, IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. The petition for confidential protection of the financial and network information contained in Exhibits A, B, C, and D, filed with the Commission on December 8, 1989, shall be held in abeyance to allow Americall to supplement its petition with a statement setting forth the grounds upon which it relies.
- 2. If such statement is not filed within 10 days, the petition for confidentiality shall, without further Orders herein, be denied.
