ORDER

By application received June 29, 1990, Reid Village Water District ("Reid Village Water") requested a deviation from Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 5(4), which provides that each utility shall provide water storage to ensure a minimum of one day's supply of its average daily water usage. Reid Village Water states in its application that its average daily water usage, including unaccounted-for water, is approximately 106,701 gallons, and that its current water storage capacity is 100,000 gallons.

The Commission, having reviewed the application and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that:

- 1. Reid Village Water is not in compliance with Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 5(4).
- 2. Because of the time needed to plan, finance, and implement a program to construct water storage facilities, Reid Village Water should be given until August 1, 1993 to bring it within compliance of Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 5(4).

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. Reid Village Water be and it hereby is given until August 1, 1993 to comply with the provisions of 807 KAR 5:066, Section 5(4).
- 2. Reid Village Water shall take all necessary actions to bring its water storage facilities into compliance with Commission regulations prior to August 1, 1993.
