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ALLEGED FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH COMMISSION REGULATIONS

#### ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

Henderson-Union Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation, Inc. ("Henderson-Union"), a Kentucky corporation which engages in the distribution of electricity to the public for compensation for lights, heat, power, and other uses, and which was formed under KRS 279.010 to 279.220, is a utility subject to Commission jurisdiction. KRS 278.010; KRS 279.210.

KRS 278.280(2) directs the Commission to prescribe rules and regulations for the performance of services by utilities. Pursuant to this statutory directive, the Commission promulgated Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3, which requires electric utilities to maintain their plant and facilities in accordance with the standards of the National Electric Safety Code (1987 Edition). Similarly, the Commission promulgated Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:006, Section 24, which requires the utilities to submit a summary written report of any utility related accident within 7 days where such accident results in death or serious injury. Commission Staff has submitted to the Commission an Electrical Utility Accident Investigation Report dated August 20, 1990, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Appendix A, which alleges:

1. On August 2, 1990, Larry Mattingly, an employee of Henderson-Union, was seriously injured while trimming tree limbs near an energized single-phase 14,400 volt primary line in Crittenden County, Kentucky. He suffered serious burns when a tree limb which he was holding came into contact with this primary line. At the time of the accident, he was not wearing the rubber gloves provided to him.

2. Mr. Mattingly's failure to wear rubber gloves while working near energized lines is a violation of National Electric Safety Code Section 42 (420H) which requires that employees use the personal protective equipment and devices provided for work.

3. Henderson-Union's safety rules require that all employees must use rubber gloves when working near energized lines.

4. At the time of the accident, Roger Adams, an employee of Henderson-Union, was supervising the tree trimming activities being performed by Mr. Mattingly.

5. Mr. Adams' failure to require Mr. Mattingly's use of rubber gloves while working near the energized line is a violation of National Electric Safety Code Section 42 (421B) which directs a foreman to "see that the safety rules and operating procedures are observed by the employees under the direction of the first line supervisor."

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6. At the time of the accident, Messrs. Adams and Mattingly were employees of Henderson-Union and acting within the scope of their employment.

7. Henderson-Union submitted a summary written report of this accident to the Commission on August 16, 1990.

8. The probable violations of Commission regulations listed are:

a. 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3, because Henderson-Union allegedly failed to comply with the standards of the National Electric Safety Code.

b. 807 KAR 5:006, Section 24, because Henderson-Union allegedly failed to submit a summary written report of this accident within 7 days of the accident's occurrence.

The Commission, on its own motion, HEREBY ORDERS that:

1. Henderson-Union shall submit to the Commission within 20 days of the date of this Order a written response to the allegations contained in the Electrical Utility Accident Investigation Report.

2. Henderson-Union shall appear on October 30, 1990 at 10:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, in Hearing Room 2 of the Commission's offices at 677 Comanche Trail, Frankfort, Kentucky, for the purposes of presenting evidence concerning the incident which is the subject of the Electrical Utility Accident Investigation Report, specifically the alleged violations of Commission Regulations 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3, and 807 KAR 5:006, Section 24, and of showing cause, if any it can, why it

should not be subjected to the penalties of KRS 278.990 for its alleged failure to comply with Commission regulations.

3. The Electrical Utility Accident Investigation Report dated August 20, 1990 is hereby made a part of the record of this case.

DESCRIPTION OF ACCIDENT Mr. Larry Mattingly was trimming a Hackberry tree on the farm of Mrs. Martha Harper. Mr. Mattingly was using a hydraulic saw to trim tree limbs which had grown into a single phase 14,400 volt primary line. While Mr. Mattingly was cutting a limb approximately eight feet long, this limb struck primary phase wire, while still in contact with Mr. Mattingly's hand. Mr. Mattingly was not wearing rubber gloves at the time of the accident. SOURCE OF INFORMATION Interviews with Mr. Charles Tucker, District Manager, Mr. John Newland, Engineering Operations and Mr. Larry

Mattingly, Lineman (victim), and an onsite investigation.

PROBABLE VIOLATIONS OF COMMISSION REGULATIONS (1) Mr. Larry Mattingly was not wearing rubber gloves at the time of contact. (2) Mr. Mattingly's foreman, Mr. Roger Adams, was present and in charge at the time of the accident but did not insure that all safety rules were being observed Reference 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(1) Acceptable Standards 1987 NESC, Section 42 (421 B.1) Duties of a First Line Supervisor. (3) Summary Written Report was not submitted within 7 days of the accident. 807 KAR 5:006, Section 24.

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

- Who: Larry Mattingly, Lineman also present Rogar Adams, Foreman and Larry Thompson, Lineman
- Where: HURE Map Number 36-59-9, property of Martha Harper
- What: Mattingly had finished trimming limbs from a walnut tree in Mrs. Harper's yard and had moved to a hackberry tree to trim it. Adams and Thompson stayed at walnut tree to clean up limbs. Hackberry tree had been trimmed previously, but had grown up over the 14,400 volt primary wire. Mattingly was using hydraulic saw to trim away overgrowth. While holding to a limb that was approximately 6-8 feet long and limb in diamater he was cutting. His plan was to push the limb away from line as it was cut. A small breeze pushed the limb so that the saw was bound. The limb fell toward the primary wire. The limb struck the wire while still in contact with the tree and Mattingly's hand. He received a shrck due to this. He was not wearing rubber gloves. He was kept overnight in Crittenden County Hospital for observation. He reported for work on Wednesday, August 8th.

Recommendations:

Larry Mattingly violated a safety rule by not wearing gloves. Roger Adams did not exercise his given responsibility as Foreman. We recommend both employees not be granted their Safety Points for the period. No other action is recommended.


