ORDER

On September 13, 1990, the Commission issued its Order in Case No. 90-013 approving certain adjustments in rates and providing under certain conditions for the further adjustment of such rates on a guarterly basis in accordance with the provisions of the Gas Cost Adjustment ("GCA") Clause set forth therein.

On March 29, 1991, Western Kentucky Gas Company ("Western") filed its quarterly GCA which is to become effective May 1, 1991 and is to remain in effect until July 31, 1991.

After reviewing the record in this case and being otherwise sufficiently advised, the Commission finds that:

1. Western's notice of March 29, 1991 set out certain revisions in rates which Western proposed to place into effect, said rates being designed to pass on to its firm sales customers the wholesale decrease in gas costs from its suppliers in the amount of 35.12 cents per Mcf, including take-or-pay billings. Western's expected gas cost for firm sales customers for the quarter beginning May 1, 1991 is \$3.0491 per Mcf which is a 38.53 cent per Mcf decrease from Western's base cost of firm gas. Western also proposes to pass on to its interruptible sales customers the wholesale decrease in gas costs in the amount of 34.87 cents per Mcf, including take-or-pay billings. Western's expected gas cost for interruptible sales customers for the quarter beginning May 1, 1991 is \$2.8154 per Mcf which is a 36.17 cent per Mcf decrease from Western's base cost of interruptible gas.

2. Western's notice set out a refund adjustment for sales customers in the amount of 25.36 cents per Mcf. The refundable amount is comprised of supplier refunds from Texas Gas Transmission Corporation ("Texas Gas"), refund adjustments, and carry-overs from previous refunds.

3. Western's notice set out a current quarter actual adjustment in the amount of (9.35) cents per Mcf to compensate for over-recovery of gas cost by the Company through the operation of its gas cost recovery procedure during the months of November and December 1990 and January 1991. The total actual adjustment for sales customers is (14.16) cents per Mcf, and is designed to correct the current over-recovery as well as under- and over-collections from three previous quarters.

4. Western's notice set out a balance adjustment for sales customers in the amount of 3.77 cents per Mcf, which replaces the previous adjustment of 1.4 cents per Mcf. This balance adjustment compensates for under-collections which occurred as a result of previous actual and balance adjustments.

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5. Western proposed a GCA of (74.28) cents per Mcf for firm sales customers and (71.92) cents per Mcf for interruptible sales customers, which represent the combined effect of the supplier decrease, and the refund, actual, and balancing adjustments.

6. Western's adjustment in rates under the provisions approved by the Commission in its Order in Case No. 90-013 dated September 13, 1990, is fair, just, and reasonable, in the public interest, and should be effective with final meter readings on and after May 1, 1991.

7. Western's filing of March 29, 1991 included supplementary information concerning its actual adjustment for which it requested confidentiality. Confidentiality should be granted based on Western's showing of the likelihood of competitive injury.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. The rates in the Appendix to this Order, attached hereto and incorporated herein, are fair, just, and reasonable and are approved effective with final meter readings on and after May 1, 1991.

2. The GCA shall be (74.28) cents per Mcf for firm sales customers and (71.92) cents per Mcf for interruptible sales customers effective with final meter readings on and after May 1, 1991.

3. Within 30 days of the date of this Order, Western shall file with this Commission its revised tariffs setting out the rates authorized herein.

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4. Western's supplemental information shall be accorded confidential treatment.

To each bill rendered under the above-named rate schedules there shall be added an amount equal to: (\$.7428) per Mcf of gas used during the billing period.

Applicable to: Interruptible Sales Service Rate G-2

Gas Cost Adjustment

To each bill rendered under the above-named rate schedules there shall be added an amount equal to: (\$.7192) per Mcf of gas used during the billing period.

The rate for the future application of the purchased gas adjustment clause of Western Kentucky Gas Company shall be: Texas Gas Transmission Corp.
