ORDER

On February 15, 1991, the Commission issued its Order in the above-styled case denying to Phelps Gas Company, Inc. ("Phelps Gas") authority to adjust the volume used by each customer prior to billing by an average ambient temperature for the billing period to more accurately reflect actual usage. By letter received February 27, 1991, Phelps Gas requested that Commission Staff render an "alternative supportive opinion" regarding Phelps Gas's proposal to the Commission for their consideration or in the alternative that Phelps "be allowed to adjust the consumption of our customers based on the temperature adjustments being made by our suppliers." Because of the relief requested, the Commission shall treat this letter as a petition for rehearing or reconsideration pursuant to KRS 278.400.

After consideration of Phelps Gas's request for reconsideration, the Commission finds that Phelps Gas has presented no additional evidence that could not with reasonable diligence have

been offered in the prior proceeding to support its request, and therefore, said request should be denied.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the request of Phelps Gas for reconsideration of the Commission's February 15, 1991 Order be and it hereby is denied.
