O R D E R

On December 28, 1990, AT&T Communications of the South Central States, Inc. ("AT&T") filed a petition seeking modification of its regulation in Kentucky. AT&T is seeking a change in the regulatory framework adopted in Administrative Case No. 273.<sup>1</sup> Specifically, AT&T requests this Commission to (1) forebear from rate of return regulation for all interexchange carriers in Kentucky; (2) remove all financial reporting requirements by AT&T except for an annual report of the Kentucky operations; (3) require 20 days notice to the public for rate decreases and 30 days notice for rate increases; (4) remove requirements for cost support in connection with application for rate adjustments and new service offerings; (5) treat all tariff filings as presumptively valid; and (6) allow AT&T to have the flexibility to maintain its system of accounts in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP).




