ORDER

By application received January 25, 1991, Southern Mason Water District ("Southern Mason") requested a deviation from Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 5(4), which provides that each utility shall provide water storage to ensure a minimum of one day's supply of its average daily water usage. Southern Mason states in its application that its average daily water usage, including unaccounted-for water, is approximately 94,167 gallons, and its current water storage capacity is 100,000 gallons.

The Commission, having reviewed the application and being otherwise sufficiently advised, finds that Southern Mason is in compliance with the requirements of Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 5(4), and as such no deviation is required.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Southern Mason is in compliance with the requirements of Commission Regulation 807 KAR 5:066, Section 5(4), and as such no deviation is required. Southern Mason's request for a deviation is hereby dismissed without prejudice.
