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## ORDER

On May 20, 1991, AT&T Communications of the South Central States, Inc. ("AT&T") filed with the Commission a proposed tariff to be effective on and after June 20, 1991. The filing would allow AT&T to implement separate rate schedules and service charge schedules associated with calls that are billed to an AT&T CIID/891 card.

On June 17, 1991, Americall Systems of Louisville ("Americall") filed a motion to suspend the tariff filing for investigation. Americall claims that the filing is discriminatory and that AT&T failed to set forth currently offered discounts associated with CIID card usage.

Based on the motion and being advised, the Commission hereby finds that the tariff filing should be suspended and that AT&T should file within 5 working days its response to AmeriCall's motion.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. AT&T's tariff filing be and it hereby is suspended for 5 months from June 20, 1991 up to and including November 19, 1991.

- 2. AT&T shall file its response to AmeriCall's motion within 5 working days from the date of this Order.
- 3. Nothing in this Order shall prevent the Commission from entering a final decision in this case prior to the termination of the suspension period.
