O R D E R

On February 13, 1992, Telenational Communications Limited Partnership ("Telenational") submitted an application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a reseller of telecommunications services within the state of Kentucky.¹ On March 12, 1992, the Commission ordered Telenational to submit additional information. Telenational's response, attached hereto and incorporated herein as Appendix A, was filed on March 30, 1992.

In the Commission's request for additional information, Telenational was asked, inter alia, whether or not it or any of its affiliates had ever provided and/or collected any money from the public for the provision of intrastate telecommunications

services in Kentucky and, if so, to explain in detail. Telenational responded affirmatively and admitted that it has provided for the provision of intrastate telecommunications services in Kentucky to two customers, the first customer being a business customer based in New York with an office in Kentucky. The second customer being a residential customer with an average monthly intrastate billing of \$10.00.

Accordingly, the Commission finds a prima facie showing has been made that Telenational failed to file with the Commission its application for approval to operate and its schedule of rates and conditions of service prior to collecting compensation for the provision of utility service in violation of KRS 278.020 and KRS 278.160. Therefore, Telenational should immediately cease and desist the provision of, and charge for, any and all telecommunications services within the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Telenational shall immediately cease and desist from providing and charging for any and all telecommunications services within the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

2. Telenational shall appear at a hearing scheduled for May 26, 1992, at 10:00 a.m., Eastern Daylight Time, in Hearing Room 1 of the Commission's offices at 730 Schenkel Lane, Frankfort, Kentucky, to present evidence on the alleged violation of KRS 278.020 and 278.160, and to be prepared to show cause why Telenational should not be penalized under KRS 278.990 and should not be required to make refunds of compensation collected prior to

filing its schedule of rates and conditions of service, if such violation is found to have occurred.


3. Telenational shall appear at an informal conference to be held on May 13, 1992, at 10:00 a.m., Eastern Daylight Time, in Conference Room 1 of the Commission's offices at 730 Schenkel Lane, Frankfort, Kentucky.



Telenational shall file within 10 days from the date of this Order all documents pertaining to its provision of service in Kentucky including, but not limited to, rates and conditions of service, promotional sales material, customer applications, a list of customers with addresses, and billing and collection records.



Question No. 5: Does Telenational Communications own and/or operate any customer owned coin operated telephones in Kentucky? If so, explain.

Answer No. 5: Telenational Communications does not own and/or operate any customer owned coin operated telephone in Kentucky.

Question No. 6: Does Telenational Communications have any affiliation with any other company which owns and/or operates any customer owned coin operated telephones in Kentucky? If so, explain.

Answer No. 6: Telenational Communications does not have any affiliation with any other company which owns and/or operates any customer owned coin operated telephones in Kentucky.
