ORDER

On October 30, 1992, Automated Communications, Inc. ("Automated Communications") filed its application with the Commission seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide intrastate, long-distance telecommunications services as a reseller within the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

Automated Communications is a Colorado corporation proposing to resell outbound services and 800 dedicated services primarily to business customers within the Commonwealth of Kentucky in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in its tariff. Automated Communications is not seeking authority to provide any operator-assisted telecommunications services.

Automated Communications employs no transmission or reception telecommunications equipment or facilities in the performance of its services, and all operating facilities, equipment, and networking will be provided by a Kentucky certified underlying carrier. Order processing and customer billing shall be provided by Automated Communications.

The application provided by Automated Communications demonstrates its financial, managerial, and technical capability. The rates proposed should be approved as the fair, just, and reasonable rates to be charged.

The Commission, having considered the application, the information provided by Automated Communications, and being otherwise sufficiently advised, HEREBY ORDERS that:

- 1. Automated Communications be and it hereby is granted authority to provide intrastate, long-distance telecommunications service as a reseller within the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- 2. Automated Communications shall comply with the provisions of the Orders in Administrative Case No. 323.1
- 3. Automated Communications' authority to provide service in this Commonwealth is strictly limited to those services described in this Order and Automated Communications' application.
- 4. The rates and charges proposed by Automated Communications on October 30, 1992 and revised on February 10, 1993 are hereby approved.
- 5. Within 30 days from the date of this Order, Automated Communications shall file its tariff sheets as proposed on October 30, 1992 and February 10, 1993 in accordance with 807 KAR 5:011 to conform to the restrictions and conditions of service contained herein.
