ORDER

On May 18, 1993, Caldwell County Water District ("Caldwell Water") filed an application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to construct a \$1,748,700 waterworks improvement project and for approval of its plan of financing for this project. This project will provide service to 252 additional customers. Project funding includes a \$410,000 loan from the Parmers Home Administration ("FmHA"), a \$1,263,100 grant from PmHA, and \$75,600 from applicants for service in the proposed project area. The loan will be for a 40-year period at an interest rate of 5 percent per annum.

Caldwell Water's application was made pursuant to KRS 278.023 which requires the Commission to accept agreements between water districts and PmHA and to issue the necessary orders to implement the terms of such agreements within 30 days of satisfactory completion of the minimum filing requirements. Given that minimum filing requirements were met in this case on May 18, 1993, KRS 278.023 does not grant the Commission any discretionary authority to modify or reject any portion of this agreement.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. Caldwell Water is hereby granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for the proposed construction project.
- 2. Caldwell Water's proposed plan of financing with FmHA is accepted.
- 3. Caldwell Water shall file a copy of the "as-built" drawings and a certified statement that the construction has been satisfactorily completed in accordance with the contract plans and specifications within 60 days of the substantial completion of the construction certificated herein.
- 4. Caldwell Water shall monitor the adequacies of the expanded water distribution system after construction. If the level of service is inadequate or declining or the pressure to any customer falls outside the requirements of 807 KAR 5:066, Section 5(1), Caldwell Water shall take immediate action to bring the system into compliance with Commission regulations.

Nothing contained herein shall be deemed a warranty of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, or any agency thereof, of the financing herein accepted.
