O R D E R

On August 16, 1993, Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU") filed with the Commission its application seeking a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to qualify it to bid on electric franchises in the cities of Beattyville, Berry, Burgin, Caneyville, Carrollton, Cave City, Centertown, Central City, Clarkson, Corydon, Eminence, Flemingsburg, Greenville, LaGrange, Lancaster, Lebanon, Lebanon Junction, Midway, Morehead, Mt. Vernon, Munfordville, New Haven, Powderly, Prestonville, Simpsonville, Sonora, Uniontown, Versailles, Warsaw and Wilmore. Under the provisions of KRS 278.020(3), no utility may apply for a franchise from any governmental agency until it has obtained a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity from this Commission based on its finding that there is a need and demand for the service sought to be rendered.

The Commission determines that there is evidence of a need and demand for electric service in the above-mentioned cities. Since the Commission's authority in such matters is limited by statute to finding only whether there is a need and demand for the service sought to be rendered, no finding or determination is made as to the qualifications of the bidder, the validity of any of the provisions of the franchises offered by said cities, or the manner in which any franchise fee is to be treated for rate purposes.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:


1. KU hereby is granted a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity which authorizes it to bid on electric franchises in the above-mentioned cities.

2. KU, if it becomes the successful bidder, shall file with this Commission two copies of each franchise agreement.


3. This Order shall not be construed as granting a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to construct utility facilities in the said cities.
