ORDER

On March 9, 1994, Kentucky-American Water Company ("Kentucky-American") filed objections to the following requests for information propounded by the Sierra Club and Chetan Talwalkar ("Talwalkar"): Sierra Club Item Nos. 6 and 9; and Talwalkar Item Nos. 2-9, 10a, b, c, e, 18, 21, 27, 31, 35 and 37. The requested information relates generally to the need for and operation of a future pipeline to purchase potable water from the Louisville Water Company. Kentucky-American argues that this issue is beyond the scope of this investigation which, in its assessment, is limited to a review of its existing sources of supply and demand forecasts. In the event its objections are contested, Kentucky-American requests a hearing.

Talwalkar responded by moving the Commission to compel Kentucky-American to file the requested information on the grounds that this potential future source of supply lies at the heart of this investigation. He notes that the pipeline to Louisville was the basis for the request to initiate this case and is characterized in Kentucky-American's direct testimony as necessary to meet its projected supply deficiency. The Sierra Club and the

Attorney General's Office, Utility and Rate Intervention Division ("AG"), also filed motions to compel on similar grounds.

In addition, the AG filed a motion to amend the procedural schedule due to his recent hiring of a consultant to submit testimony on the ratepayers' behalf. Kentucky-American responded by stating numerous reasons why the AG's motion lacked merit, but concluded that if the procedural schedule is modified every effort should be made to process this case in an expeditious manner.

Based on the objections and the motions to compel, the Commission hereby finds that a hearing is unnecessary since our March 25, 1994 Order expressly stated that this investigation was not limited to Kentucky-American's current sources of supply but included the feasibility of alternative sources of supply such as the pipeline to Louisville. Consequently, the information requested by the Sierra Club and Talwalkar appears to be reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of relevant evidence and should be produced. To the extent that any of the responses are voluminous, Kentucky-American need only file two copies with the Commission. The Commission further finds that the procedural schedule should be modified in accord with the AG's request.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

1. Kentucky-American's objections to the information requests enumerated above be and they hereby are overruled and the motions to compel are granted.

2. The procedural schedule established by Order dated January 26, 1994 be and it hereby is modified as set forth in Appendix A.
