O R D E R

On August 22, 1995, IntelliCom Solutions, Inc. ("IntelliCom") filed an application with the Commission seeking a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to resell intrastate interexchange long-distance telecommunications services within the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

IntelliCom is a Pennsylvania corporation with its principal offices in the state of Pennsylvania and intends to resell tariffed services of facilities-based carriers certified by this Commission. IntelliCom does not request authority to provide operator-assisted telecommunications services.

IntelliCom does not own or operate, nor does it intend to construct, any telecommunications transmission facilities within the Commonwealth of Kentucky. All intrastate telecommunications transmission services will be provided by an underlying carrier certified by this Commission.

The application provided by IntelliCom demonstrates its financial, managerial, and technical capability to provide utility service. The Commission finds that IntelliCom should be authorized

to resell intrastate interexchange long-distance telecommunications services within the Commonwealth of Kentucky. The Commission finds that the rates proposed by IntelliCom should be approved as the fair, just, and reasonable rates to be charged.

In Administrative Case No. 306,¹ the Commission stated the importance of eliminating possible customer confusion arising from the name of the billing service, rather than the name of the provider of telecommunications services, appearing on the bill. Accordingly, IntelliCom should ensure that its name appears prominently on all bills issued to customers for services rendered.

The Commission, having considered the evidence of record and being otherwise sufficiently advised, HEREBY ORDERS that:

1. IntelliCom be and it hereby is granted authority to resell intrastate interexchange long-distance telecommunications services within the Commonwealth of Kentucky on and after the date of this Order.

2. IntelliCom shall ensure that its name appears prominently on all bills issued to customers for services rendered.

3. IntelliCom's authority to provide service is strictly limited to those services described in this Order and IntelliCom's application.


4. IntraLATA services shall be provided in accordance with the restrictions and conditions of service contained in Administrative Case No. 323.²

5. The rates proposed by IntelliCom on August 22, 1995 are hereby approved.

6. Within 30 days from the date of this Order, IntelliCom shall file, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:011, its August 22, 1995 tariff sheets without modifications.
