RE: Case No. 95-381/Contel Cellular of Kentucky, Inc.

To Whom It May Concern:

The City of Eminence, Kentucky has received notification from counsel for Contel Cellular of Kentucky, Inc. that application has been made for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate and construct a new cell facility for cellular radio telecommunication service. The application calls for this facility to be located either within or in close proximity to the city limits of the City of Eminence, Kentucky. By this letter, the City of Eminence, Kentucky expresses its disapproval and opposition to the present location for the facility. The reasons for the City's objections are as follows:

1. The tower is proposed to be placed in an area that is in close proximity to both residential and business districts of the City of Eminence. This is an area that is likely to see further residential and business development. Such residential and business development would be adversely affected by location of this tower at the proposed site.


2. The tower is proposed to be placed in an area that is in close proximity to other businesses and public entities that depend upon radio communications. The location of this tower at the proposed site would have an adverse effect on the ability of these businesses and public agencies to depend upon their radio communications facilities as they now exist.

3. The City is advised that there is another telecommunications tower proposed for location near the Eminence City limits. Although the City has received no formal notification or right to object, such towers are not properly located in or near densely populated areas such as the City of Eminence and are better placed outside of city limits for multiple reasons including the health and welfare of the citizenry, the negative impact on existing communications and on business development and for other aesthetic and substantive reasons.

4. Placement of a tower at the present location would

have a negative impact on property values in the areas of Eminence adjacent to this development.

As Mayor of the City of Eminence, I can fairly state that we always try to encourage development in and near our town. Cellular phones play a valuable role in any community and it is recognized that a cellular tower in this area would be beneficial to the citizens. However, the proposed location is one that is inappropriate and would have many negative impacts upon the citizens of Eminence, Kentucky. Thank you for the opportunity to express these concerns on behalf of the City of Eminence, Kentucky.
