## <u>O R D E R</u>

This matter arising upon petition of BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a South Central Bell Telephone Company ("BellBouth"), filed October 26, 1995, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Bection 7, for confidential protection of the cost support data developed in connection with a special service arrangement contract with Ann Taylor for Four-Wire AccuPulse® Service on the grounds that disclosure of the information is likely to cause BellSouth competitive injury, and it appearing to this Commission as follows:

BellSouth has contracted with Ann Taylor to provide Four-Wire AccuPulse® Service. This service is currently tariffed, but is only available under the tariff through a two-wire facility. In support of its application for approval of the contract, BellSouth has provided cost data which it seeks to protect as confidential.

The information sought to be protected is not known outside of BellSouth and is not disseminated within BellSouth except to those employees who have a legitimate business need to know and to act upon the information. BellSouth seeks to preserve and protect the confidentiality of the information through all appropriate means, including the maintenance of appropriate security at its offices.

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KRS 61.872(1) requires information filed with the Commission to be available for public inspection unless specifically exempted by statuto. Exemptions from this requirement are provided in KRS That subsoction of the statute exempts several 61.878(1). categories of information. One category exempted in paragraph (c)1 of that subsection is commercial information confidentially disclosed to the Commission which if made public would permit an unfair commercial advantage to competitors of the party from whom the information was obtained. To qualify for the exemption, the party claiming confidentiality must demonstrate actual competition and a likelihood of substantial competitive injury if the information is disclosed. Competitive injury occura whon disclosure of the information gives competitors an unfair business advantage.

AccuPulse® Service is an alternative to dedicated private line networks and utilizes the exchange switching network. Competitors for the service are providers of microwave service, digital radio and fiber networks. Disclosure of the information would enable competitors to determine BellSouth's cost and contribution from the service which they could use in marketing their competing services to the detriment of BellSouth. Therefore, disclosure of the

information is likely to cause BellSouth competitive injury and the information should be protected as confidential.

This Commission being otherwise sufficiently advised,

IT IS ORDERED that the cost support data filed in support of the proposed contract with Ann Taylor, which BellSouth has petitioned to be withheld from public disclosure, shall be held and retained by this Commission as confidential and shall not be open for public inspection.
