## ORDER

This matter arising upon petition of BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth"), filed July 15,1996, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 7, for confidential protection of the cost data filed in support of its proposed contract with Caretenders for CrisisLink<sup>SM</sup> Service on the grounds that disclosure of the information is likely to cause BellSouth competitive injury and it appearing to this Commission as follows:

BellSouth has contracted with Caretenders to provide CrisisLink<sup>SM</sup> Service. CrisisLink<sup>SM</sup> is a service that is currently tariffed, but is only available in certain digital central offices. This customer's location is served by an analog central office switch. In support of its application for the approval of the contract, BellSouth has filed cost information which it seeks to protect as confidential.

The information sought to be protected is not known outside of BellSouth and is not disseminated within BellSouth except to those employees who have a legitimate business need to know and act upon the information. BellSouth seeks to preserve and protect the confidentiality of the information through all appropriate means, including the maintenance of appropriate security at its offices.

KRS 61.872(1) requires information filed with the Commission to be available for public inspection unless specifically exempted by statute. Exemptions from this requirement are provided in KRS 61.878(1). That subsection of the statute exempts several categories of information. One category exempted in paragraph (c)1 of that subsection is commercial information confidentially disclosed to the Commission which if made public would permit an unfair commercial advantage to competitors of the party from whom the information was obtained. To qualify for the exemption, the party claiming confidentiality must demonstrate actual competition and a likelihood of substantial competitive injury if the information is disclosed. Competitive injury occurs when disclosure of the information gives competitors an unfair business advantage.

BellSouth's competitors for this service are providers of single number service, including inter-exchange carriers and other vendors. Disclosure of the information would enable competitors to determine BellSouth's cost and contribution from the service, which they could use in marketing their competing services to the detriment of BellSouth. Therefore, disclosure of the information is likely to cause BellSouth competitive injury, and the information should be protected as confidential.

This Commission being otherwise sufficiently advised,

IT IS ORDERED that the cost information filed in support of the proposed contract with Caretenders for CrisisLink<sup>SM</sup> Service, which BellSouth has petitioned to be withheld from public disclosure, shall be held and retained by this Commission as confidential and shall not be opened for public inspection.
