ORDER

On September 23, 1996, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. filed a proposed tariff to place constraints on the number of residence service lines that residential subscribers can have at their private residence location. The proposed tariff revision will limit the number of residence service lines to ten lines per private residence location with a maximum of three of those lines in a rotary or hunting arrangement for residence locations.

The Commission finds that, pursuant to KRS 278.190, further proceedings are necessary in order to determine the reasonableness of the proposed tariff.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- 1. The proposed tariff is suspended for five months from October 23, 1996 up to and including March 22, 1997.
- 2. Nothing in this Order shall prevent the Commission from entering a final decision in this case prior to the termination of the suspension period.
