2. GTE Mobilnet shall file a copy of the certified letter and dated receipt, within 7 days of the date of the receipt.



MOTION FOR FULL INTERVENTION

Comes Highlands Health Care Realty, LTD ("Highlands Health Care"), by and through counsel, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section 3(8), and hereby moves the Commission for leave to intervene as a party in the above-captioned proceeding, and respectfully requests that it be granted full intervention on the following grounds:

1. Highlands Health Care, which has a mailing address of 960 Highland Avenue, Ft. Thomas, Kentucky 41075, was notified by GTE Mobilnet Incorporated ("GTE Mobilnet") through counsel of its Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to locate, construct and operate a new personal communications service facility (the "PCS Facility") within five hundred feet (500') of Highlands Health Care facilities.

2. The location of the PCS Facility, which consists of a one hundred fifty foot (150') monopole with attached antennae extending upwards for a total height of one hundred fifty-five feet (155')

and an equipment cabinet, is to be placed on property (owned by the Provincial Convent of the Good Shepherd) immediately adjacent to the nursing and health care complex of Highlands Health Care and its proposed construction of a multi-million dollar assisted living complex or facility.

3. Highlands Health Care believes that the proposed location of the PCS Facility will have a significant adverse impact on the value, use and operation of its nursing, health care and proposed assisted living complexes or facilities. Further, placement of the PCS Facility at the proposed location may have certain safety ramifications which require addressing.

4. Highlands Health Care believes, given the size in total acreage of the property of the Provincial Convent of the Good Shepherd, the PCS Facility could and should be located at another location which will not adversely impact the property of Highlands Health Care or the property of other adjacent property owners. Additionally, Highlands Health Care believes there are other sites on the property of the Provincial Convent of the Good Shepherd that are optimal in terms of elevation and location which will provide the best quality service to Mobilnet's customers in the MTA.

5. Highlands Health Care has a special interest in this proceeding which it believes will not be adequately represented unless full intervention in the proceeding is granted, and such intervention, if granted, is likely to present issues or to develop facts that will assist the Commission in fully considering the matter without unduly complicating or disrupting the proceeding.

WHEREFORE, Highlands Health Care requests that full intervention be granted in the above-captioned proceeding.


